
Welcome to Annunciation of the Blessed Virgin Mary Catholic Church Second Sunday of Lent February 25, 2024

Rediscovering Your Catholic Faith From the Catechism of the Catholic Church PART ONE: THE PROFESSION OF FAITH

Section One: "I Believe" – "We Believe"

CHAPTER TWO: God Comes to Meet Man

The Transmission of Divine Revelation

16. To whom is given the task of authentically interpreting the deposit of faith?

The Task of giving an authentic interpretation of the deposit of faith has been entrusted to the living teaching office of the Church alone, that is, to the successor of Peter, the Bishop of Rome, and to the bishops in communion with him. To this Magisterium, which in the service of the Word of God enjoys the certain charism of truth, belongs also the task of defining dogmas which are formulations of the truths contained in divine Revelation. This authority of the Magisterium also extends to those truths necessarily connected with Revelation.

17. What is the relationship between Scripture, Tradition and the Magisterium?

Scripture, Tradition, and the Magisterium are so closely united with each other that one of them cannot stand without the others. Working together, each in its own way, under the action of the one Holy Spirit, they all contribute effectively to the salvation of souls.

Sacred Scripture

18. Why does Sacred Scripture teach the truth?


Because God himself is the author of Sacred Scripture. For this reason it is said to be inspired and to t each without error those truths which are necessary for our salvation. The Holy Spirit inspired the human authors who wrote what he wanted to teach us. The Christian faith, however, is not a "religion of the Book," but of the Word of God-- "not a written and mute word, but incarnate and living" (Saint Bernard of Clairvaux).

19. how is Sacred Scripture to be read?

Sacred Scripture must be read and interpreted with the help of the Holy Spirit and under the guidance of the Magisterium of the Church according to three criteria: (1) it must be read with attention to the content and unity of the whole of Scripture; (2) it must be read within the living Tradition of the Church; (3) it must be read with attention to the analogy of faith, that is, the inner harmony which exists among the truths of the faith themselves.

20. What is the Canon of Scripture?

The *Canon* of Scripture is the complete list of the sacred writings which the Church has come to recognize through Apostolic Tradition. The *Canon* consists of 46 books of the Old Testament and 27 of the New.





Stroke Scan Plus will be hosting a Stroke, Vascular & Abdominal Ultrasound Screening at Annunciation of the Blessed Virgin Mary Catholic Church on Thursday, February 29, 2024.

They will check the Carotid Arteries on both sides of the neck for fatty plaque build-up which accounts for 80% of all strokes. They check the Abdominal Aorta which is the main Artery off the Heart for Aneurysms, the Thyroid which controls the Metabolism for cyst, nodules and enlargements, the Liver, Gallbladder and both Kidney's for cyst, masses, fluid build-up and tumors.

These screenings are NOT typically performed at annual physicals, nor will insurance companies pay for them unless you are symptomatic. Collectively, these screenings cost thousands in a hospital. Stroke Scan will be offering them to you for \$169 for all 7 combined. Health/Flex Savings Accounts are accepted. A representative will be visiting the weekend of February 17th/18th to answer questions and for pre-registration. Payment isn't due until the day of screening. Call (832) 437-7355 for an appointment today. Prevention is the KEY to early detection!

Marywood Cemetery Rules and Regulations

March 1-15 and November 1-15 are used to clean up the grounds and prepare the cemetery for the spring and winter. All decorations will be removed and disposed of at this time. If you wish to save your decoration, please remove it before it March 1 and before November 1. Please do not place any decorations during the clean up times. After November 1st, when the grass is not being cut, artificial wreaths no more than 30 inches in diameter placed on stands are permitted. No artificial flowers permitted from Nov. 1 to March 1.

Dogs visiting the cemetery with their owners are required to be on leash, and are to be kept on paved surfaces.

Planting beds of up to 18 inches are permitted directly in front of a raised family monument. Only potted or cut flowers are permitted on graves with flat monuments. Decorative stones and border edging are strictly prohibited. Woody perennials such as trees, buses, or evergreens are not permitted. Permanent in-ground vases are not permitted.

Evergreen blankets or grave coverings are not permitted because they damage the grass and encourages rodent populations.

No planting of trees is permitted and all graves must be seeded in grass.

Decorations that do not conform to cemetery regulations will be removed by the caretakers.

We are not responsible for monuments, flat stones, flowers, shrubbery, pots, decorations, etc.

No shepherd hooks of any kind are permitted due to the danger they present to our mowing crew.

We encourage the placement of decorations and will try to be as careful as possible during our normal interment and maintenance activities. We regret that we cannot guarantee that all decorations will be free of damage of loss and we cannot accept responsibility for these occurrences.

The Catholic Cemetery is a holy place and the grounds have been blessed by the Church and dedicated as a place of prayer and dignity for our faithful departed. Please maintain a quiet reverence and respect for the other people visiting the graves of loved ones.

Baptism:

Please contact the parish office to schedule. Normally baptisms take place on Sunday afternoons, after the last Mass.

The Sacrament of Reconciliation:

Marriage:

The bride, groom, or either of their parents must be registered, contributing members of the parish. Weddings must be scheduled no less than six months out in order to fulfill the diocesan marriage preparation requirements. If there were any previous marriages that were not annulled by the Church, then it must be pointed out that the annulment process could take up to two years.
