

# From the Desk of Fr. Patrick

My brothers and sisters, the Apostle tells us, in his letter to the Romans, "...we who were baptized into Christ Jesus were baptized into His death...so that, just as Christ was raised from the dead by the glory of the Father, we too might live in newness of life. For if we have grown into union with Him through a death like His, we shall also be united with Him in the Resurrection."

# **Rediscovering Your Catholic Faith**

From the Catechism of the Catholic Church

## PART ONE: THE PROFESSION OF FAITH

Section Two: The Profession of Faith

Chapter One: I Believe in God the Father

"I Believe in God the Father Almighty, Creator of Heaven and

#### 42. In what way does God reveal that he is love?

God revealed himself to Israel as the One who has a stronger love than that of parents for their children or of husbands and wives for their spouses. God in himself "is love" (1 John 4:8, 16), who gives himself completely and gratuitously, who "so loved the world that he gave his only Son [so] that the world might be saved through him" (John 3:16-17). By sending his Son and the Holy Spirit, God reveals that he himself is an eternal exchange of love.

#### 43. What does it mean to believe in only one God?

To believe in the one and only God involves coming to know his greatness and majesty. It involves living in thanksgiving and trusting always in him, even in adversity. It involves knowing the unity and true dignity of all human beings, created in his image. It involves making good use of the things which he has created.

#### 44. What is the central mystery of Christian faith and life? The central mystery of Christian faith and life is the mystery of the Most Blessed Trinity. Christians are baptized in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit.

#### 45. Can the mystery of the Most Holy Trinity be known by the light of human reason alone?

God has left some traces of his trinitarian being in creation and in the Old Testament but his inmost being as the Holy Trinity is a mystery which is inaccessible to reason alone or even to Israel's faith before the Incarnation of the Son of God and the sending of the Holy Spirit. This mystery was revealed by Jesus Christ and it is the source of all the other mysteries.

#### 46. What did Jesus Christ reveal to us about the mystery of the Father?

Jesus Christ revealed to us that God is "Father," not only insofar as he created the universe and mankind, but above all because he eternally generated in his bosom the Son who is his word, "the radiance of the glory of God and the very stamp of his nature" (Hebrews 1:3).

47. Who is the Holy Spirit revealed to us by Jesus Christ? The Holy Spirit is the third person of the Most Blessed Trinity. He is God, one and equal with the Father and the Son. He "proceeds from the Father" (John 15:26) who is the principle without a principle and the origin of all trinitarian life. He proceeds also from the Son (Filioque) by the eternal Gift which the Father makes of him to the Son. Sent by the Father and the Incarnate Son, the Holy Spirit guides the Church "to know all truth" (John 16:13).

Anissa Norris: In today's world there is a big emphasis on physical and mental healthcare, but along with that, and most importantly, spiritual health must be a priority. With a solid, genuine & faithful relationship with God, then every thing else seems to fall in place. Understanding of his love and mercy allows for a life full of hope and joy. Raised as a Catholic, the RCIA program has helped me to grow an even closer relationship with God and understanding of our the basis of our Catholic faith and for that I am forever grateful!

#### **Baptism**:

Please contact the parish office to schedule. Normally baptisms take place on Sunday afternoons, after the last Mass.

#### **The Sacrament of Reconciliation:**

Saturday.....4:00-4:45pm, or you may call the parish office for an appointment.

#### Marriage:

The bride, groom, or either of their parents must be registered, contributing members of the parish. Weddings must be scheduled no less than six months out in order to fulfill the diocesan marriage preparation requirements. If there were any previous marriages that were not annulled by the Church, then it must be pointed out that the annulment process could take up to two years.

#### **Anointing of the Sick:**

Whenever someone is seriously ill, hospitalized, or is dying, please contact the parish office immediately.

Communion for the Sick: Please call the parish office.

<u>Adoration</u>: Is normally celebrated on the first Friday of the month, after the 8:00 Mass, with Liturgy of the Word and Benediction at 4pm.




