Peter seems to be pretty tough with his listeners in the first reading. He practically says they handed Jesus over, denied him before Pilate, asked for a murderer to be released in his place, and put Jesus to death. They must have thought they were doomed. But then he tells them that God had planned all this long ago. So is he saying Jesus' death is their fault, or just fate?

The answer of course is that it's everyone's fault. We deny Jesus when we choose to be selfish instead of loving. We crucify Jesus when we follow the crowd instead of following the Lord. It is only "fate" in the sense that our sins needed to be forgiven and God plan's for salvation was through Jesus' death and resurrection. There were sinners long before Jesus' time and God knew there would be sinners after that. Jesus rose from the dead to show that God's forgiveness raises us up from guilt to a new life.

So Peter wasn't laying a guilt trip on the listeners: this is good news. God planned all this to show how much he loved us. Our response should be one of joy that we are forgiven because of that love. All we have to do is tell God we are sorry, mean it, and start living our response of love. Sins may be our fault, but Love is our fate.

From the Desk of Fr. Patrick

My brothers and sisters, in one way or another, all of us have experienced an unexpected visit from someone. As we all probably know, those unexpected visits can be good or they can be bad. Bad, if the house is a mess; good, if you just happened to have cleaned it before the "drop-bys" arrived. Either way, we are all familiar with the unexpected drop-by.

On this third Sunday of Easter, we hear that our Lord unexpectedly dropped by. The Apostles shared in a visit with the Risen Lord. St. Luke tells us that the Apostles were, at first, frightened, because they had mistakenly thought that they were seeing a ghost. His appearance scared them.

My brothers and sisters, if today the Lord were to appear suddenly in all His glory, would you be frightened or would you be joyous, ready or not? It's safe to say that the only way His sudden appearance would be frightening is if we were not ready for Him.

There is a good chance that our risen, glorified Lord could stop by, unexpectedly; He could very well make that unexpected visit. If He does, will the house of your heart be cleaned and ready for His unexpected dropby?

My brothers and sisters, the Apostles were able to recognize our Lord when He broke bread with them. If we receive our Lord in the Eucharist as often as we can—that is, when we gather to break Bread in Church—then we will obtain so much familiarity and intimacy with Him that we will not be surprised at all if He were to appear to us suddenly, through locked doors, in His glorified, risen Body. At that moment, we would simply say with such contentment, "I've been expecting You; please come in."

Rediscovering Your Catholic Faith

From the Catechism of the Catholic Church

PART ONE: THE PROFESSION OF FAITH

Section Two: The Profession of Faith

Chapter One: I Believe in God the Father

"I Believe in God the Father Almighty, Creator of Heaven and Earth

48. Who does the Church express her trinitarian faith?

The Church expresses her trinitarian faith by professing a belief in the oneness of God in whom there are three Persons: Father, Son, and Holy Spirit. The three divine persons are only one God because each of them equally possesses the fullness of the one and indivisible divine nature. They are really distinct from each other by reason of the relations which place them in correspondence to each other. The Father generates the Son; the Son is generated by the Father; the Holy Spirit proceeds from the Father and the Son.

49. How do the three divine Persons work?

Inseparable in their one substance, the three Persons are also inseparable in their activity. The Trinity has one operation, sole and the same. In this one divine action, however, each Person is present according to the mode which is proper to him in the Trinity.

"O my God, Trinity whom I adore....grant my soul peace; make it your heaven, your beloved dwelling, and the place of your rest. May I never abandon you there, but may I be there, whole and entire, completely vigilant in my faith, entirely adoring, and wholly given to your creative action." (Blessed Elizabeth of the Trinity)

50. What does it mean to say that God is almighty?

God reveals himself as "the strong One, the mighty One" (Psalm 24:8), as the One "to whom nothing is impossible" (Luke 1:37). His omnipotence is universal, mysterious and shows itself in the creation of the world out of nothing and humanity out of love; but above all it shows itself in the Incarnation and the Resurrection of his Son, in gift of filial adoption and in the forgiveness of sins. For this reason, the Church directs her prayers to the "almighty and eternal God" ("Omnipotens sempiterne Deus...")

51. What is the importance of affirming "In the beginning God created the heavens and the earth" (Genesis 1:1)?

The significance is that creation is the foundation of all God's saving plans. It show forth the almighty and wise love of God with his people. It is the beginning of the history of salvation which culminates in Christ; and it is the first answer to our fundamental questions regarding our very origin and destiny.

52. Who created the world?

The Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit are the one and indivisible principle of creation even though the work of creating the world is particularly attributed to God the Father.


