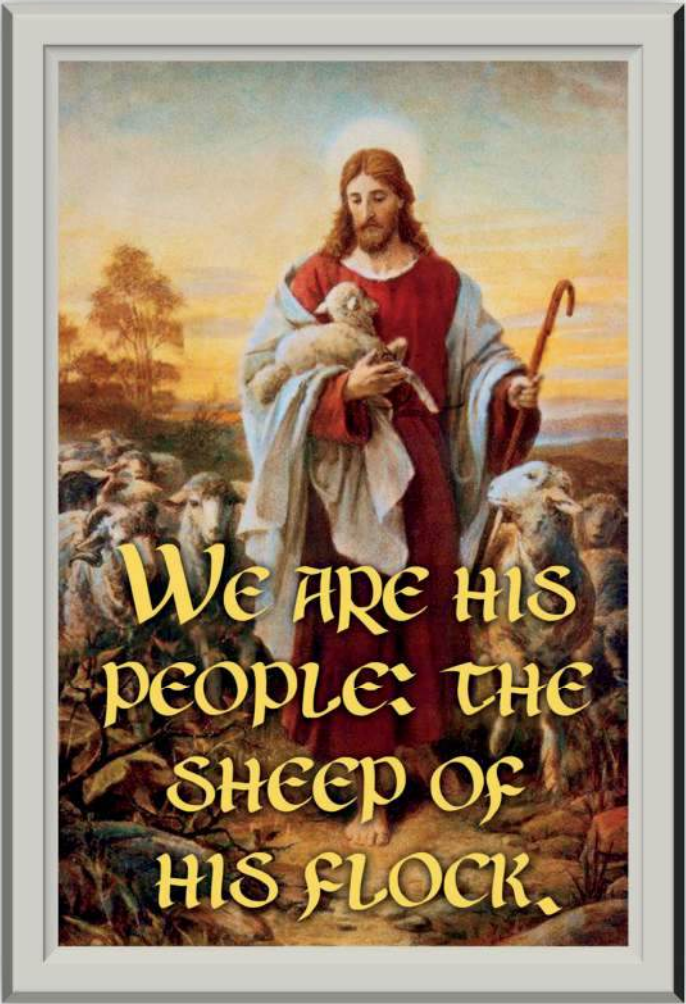


Mass Schedule:

You simply go to this website: <https://formed.org> (This is a secure site, which is why there is an “s” in the address). Once there, you will want to click on “Sign Up” (do not click on “Sign In”). In the next prompt, choose “Sign up as a parishioner.” The next prompt will ask you to “Create a New Account.” In the search box, put in the parish’s zip code: 60505. That will give you Annunciation as your choice. Click on that, and then click “next.” From there, you’ll put in your personal information.

From the Desk of Father McFadden:

This past Friday, we had a reason to celebrate as a parish family. It was the Solemnity of the Sacred Heart of Jesus. Our Bishops consecrated our country to Christ's Sacred Heart on June 11th, and this last Friday on June 12th, I consecrated our parish to the Sacred Heart after the 8:45 Mass.

To refer to Christ's Sacred Heart denotes the entire mystery of His humanity, the totality of His being, and His person. Devotion to the Sacred Heart calls for a fundamental attitude of conversion and reparation, of love and gratitude, apostolic commitment, and dedication to Christ and His saving work. Pope Benedict XVI said that "The essential nucleus of Christianity is expressed in the Heart of Jesus; in Christ the whole of the revolutionary newness of the Gospel was revealed and given to us: the Love that saves us and already makes us live in God's eternity. Even our shortcomings, our limitations, and our weaknesses must lead us back to the Heart of Jesus. His divine Heart calls to our hearts, inviting us to come out of ourselves, to abandon our human certainties to trust in Him and, following His example, to make of ourselves a gift of love without reserve."

It is not an accident of the liturgical calendar that this feast falls here, at the heart of summer, in the heart of Ordinary Time. It is a divine invitation: in the ordinary rhythm of your daily life, stop — and let yourself be loved.

The Sacred Heart of Jesus represents His divine love for humanity, demonstrated most tangibly by the sacrifice of His life for our sins. Every drop of that love was freely given. He was not compelled. He was not coerced. He chose the cross — for you, for your family, for your neighbor, for the stranger — because His Heart could do nothing less.

The Solemnity has passed, but the grace it offers does not expire. June is traditionally the month dedicated to the Sacred Heart, and the invitation is to take time to devote yourself to the Sacred Heart of Jesus and consecrate yourself to Him during this month. Consider making or renewing a personal act of consecration to the Sacred Heart this week. Pray the Litany of the Sacred Heart. Go to Confession — for the Heart of Jesus is most fully encountered in the mercy of that sacrament. And ask yourself, as you go about the ordinary moments of your week: Is my heart open to His?

Rediscovering Your Catholic Faith

From the Compendium of the Catechism of the Catholic Church

PART ONE: THE PROFESSION OF FAITH

Section Two: The Profession of Faith

CHAPTER TWO: I Believe In Jesus Christ the Only Son of God

“JESUS CHRIST DESCENDED INTO HELL; ON THE THIRD DAY HE ROSE AGAIN FROM THE DEAD”

126. What place does the Resurrection of Christ occupy in our faith?

The Resurrection of Jesus is the crowning truth of our faith in Christ and represents along with his cross an essential part of the Pascal Mystery.

127. What are the signs that bear witness to the Resurrection of Jesus?)

Along with the essential sign of the empty tomb, the Resurrection of Jesus is witnessed to by the women who first encountered Christ and proclaimed him to the Apostles. Jesus then “appeared to Cephas [Peter], and then to the twelve. Then he appeared to more than five hundred brethren at one time” (1 Corinthians 15:5-6) and to others as well. The Apostles could not have invented the story of the resurrection since it seemed impossible to them. As a matter of fact, Jesus himself upbraided them for their unbelief.

128. Why is the Resurrection at the same time a transcendent occurrence?

While being a historical event, verifiable and attested by signs and testimonies, the Resurrection, insofar as it is the entrance of Christ’s humanity into the glory of God, transcends and surpasses history as a mystery of faith. For this reason the risen Christ did not manifest himself to the world but to his disciples, making them his witnesses to the people.

129. What is the condition of the risen body of Jesus?

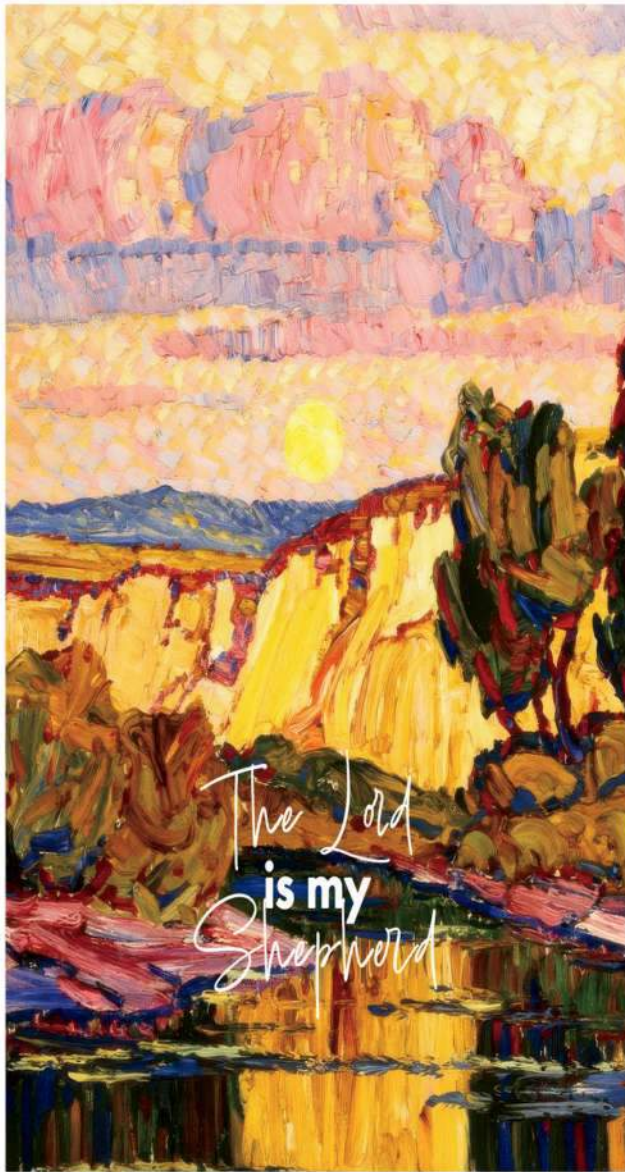
The Resurrection of Christ was not a return to earthly life. His risen body is that which was crucified and bears the marks of his Passion. However it also participates in the divine life, with the characteristics of a glorified Body. Because of this the risen Jesus was utterly free to appear to his disciples how and where he wished and under various aspects.

130. How is the Resurrection the work of the Most Holy Trinity?

The Resurrection of Christ is a transcendent work of God. The three Persons act together to what is proper to them: the Father manifests his power; the Son “takes again” the life which he freely offered (John 10:17), reuniting his soul and his body which the Spirit brings to life and glorifies.

131. What is the saving meaning of the Resurrection?

The Resurrection is the climax of the Incarnation. It confirms the divinity of Christ and all the things which he did and taught. It fulfills all the divine promises made us. Furthermore the risen Christ, the conqueror of sin and death, is the principle of our justification and our Resurrection. It procures for us now the grace of filial adoption which is a real share in the life of the only begotten Son. At the end of time he will raise up our bodies.

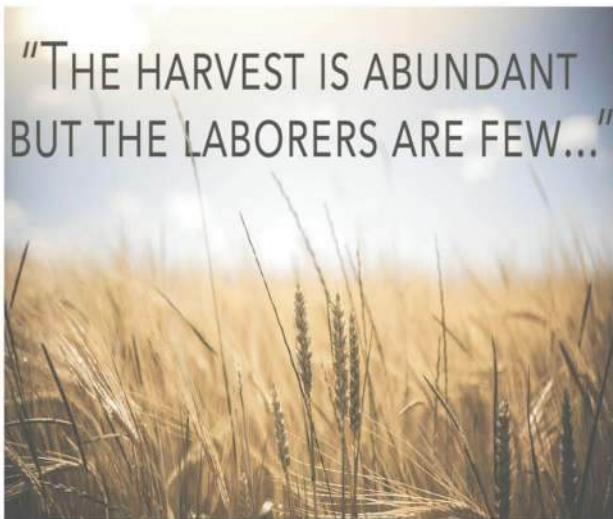
